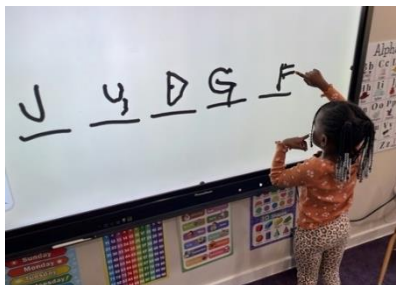
The Little Gym

BERRIES GONE BAD

Strawberries, blueberries, or raspberries will work for this recipe!

Procedure:

1. Chop berries and combine in a bowl with yogurt and sweetener or choice.
2. Spoon mixture onto a lined baking sheet into small dollops.
3. Freeze until solid.
4. Melt chocolate until smooth.
5. Dip each frozen cluster in chocolate until completely coated.
